Mobile Phones

You may have seen in the media or heard from high school students in your family that the Department of Education has started a ban on mobile phones in schools from this term. In preparation for this each school was able to choose the best management plan for them, from five different options. The five options were,

- Phones collected and stored in classroom
- Phones stored in school office



As our existing system for student mobile phones was for them to be stored in the front office, we chose *Option 5 – Phones stored in school office*. WHO: Parents are welcome to attend, watch the parade and enjoy our event.


WHAT: All students are encouraged to dress up as a character from a book, movie or show. Students have free choice to decide what they dress up as and create their costume at home.

Bush Fires

Peats Ridge PS has been rated as a Category 1 school when it comes to bushfires. This means that if the RFS sets the Fire Danger Rating to "Catastrophic" the school will be non-operational for that day. Fire Danger Ratings describe the potential level of danger should a fire start. The ratings are determined by a combination of factors including air temperature, relative humidity, wind speed and drought. Our Fire Danger Rating for today, Wednesday, was "Extreme" with a total fire ban. Check this website for more information about Fire Danger Ratings. To support the health, safety and wellbeing of

students and staff, the department, in consultation with NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS), will direct the school to temporarily cease operations on days when a Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating has been declared for your school's NSW fire area. Alternative learning arrangements will be put in place for these days. Schools may be directed by the department to become non-operational at any time based on advice from emergency services and the State Emergency Operations Centre.

At approximately 4:00pm each day the Fire Danger Rating is issued for the following day. This means that schools, including onsite preschools, will be notified after school

hours that it will be non-operational the following day. Your school will notify you as soon as possible by the preferred method of communication.

Parents and carers are requested to:

- provide up-to-date home and after-hours contact details to your school
- stay up-to-date with news and local media through the bushfire danger period through the following ways,
